The two day Crisis Intervention Team Dispatcher Training just wrapped up with great attendance for each day. Although the training received press coverage to promote the good work of the training, Aleisha expressed her apologies for panelist content that was shared in an article.

To offer support and help strengthen the Recovery Engagement Team (RET), there will be an all day workshop on December 1 with guest speaker Daniel Meloy. - **E. Rigel/Oriana House-** In October of 2018, it was approved to contract with Oriana House in the amount of \$150,000 to establish a Drug Court. David Browne was pleased to share that the "Compass" Drug Court has received a grant in the amount of \$500,000 allowing the program to be independently funded.
- F. Hopewell Health- There were no updates to the report or questions offered.

PAX-Tammy Harris shared that the November PAX Tools training just wrapped up. With financial assistance from the Board, Tammy would like to make available PAX Tools training to non-violent Compass Drug Court participants. PAX Tools is a collection of nine practical evidence-based trauma-informed strategies that can be used at home to improve cooperation and self-regulation with youth. PAX Tools for School at Home will launch in the winter of 20-21. Tammy anticipates the launch will be helpful to parents and children especially during COVID related remote learning.

Attendees reviewed the Washington County School district scan that was included in the Board packet.

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## XII. Committee Reports

A. Program Planning & Oversight – Dr. Raney shared that the committee met on November 10 to discuss the 2019-2021 Washington County Behavioral Health Board Strategic Plan, the continuum of services, and strategies for the upcoming levy renewal. The committee also identified the following action items. (1) Authorize the Executive Director to contract for recovery housing with several providers (2) Review contract language, update, and sign new contracts with current providers (3) Staff initiate conversations with local Judges to discuss establishing a Mental Health Court (4) Staff investigate establishing a contract to audit/evaluate current providers and a contract to perform a Community Health Assessment (5) Staff plan for a Strategic Planning session prior to the Mental Health Levy campaign in 2022.

The next meeting will be offered in-person at the Board office, and virtual on November 24 at 5 p.m. to discuss the Marietta Memorial Hospital Peer Recovery Support proposal.

- **B.** Community Relations Eric Johnston shared that the committee met virtually on November 10 to discuss moving forward with the "Meet Your Board" initiative, scheduling a Scholarship Advisory Committee meeting for November 24 at 6 p.m. and logistics of the Recognition event tentatively scheduled for June 10, 2021. The committee decided it would be best to revisit the Recognition event in February of 2021 to review COVID restrictions before moving forward with planning.
