# The following are some signs and symptoms of mental illness:

- Feeling sad, down, hopeless, and helpless
- Problems with speech, logical thinking, concentration, or memory not explained by any physical conditions
- Feeling disconnected from people and events
- Detachment from reality (delusions), paranoia, or hallucinations
- Significant tiredness and low energy OR excessive energy and hyperactivity
- Feeling unable to cope with problems and stress
- Paranoia, fear or suspiciousness of other people; anxiety
- Trouble understanding and relating to situations and people
- Alcohol or drug use
- Major changes in eating habits, personal hygiene, and/or sleeping habits
- Unusual or peculiar behavior
- Excessive anger, hostility, or, violence
- Thinking about suicide
- Unexplained physical discomforts, such as stomach ache, back pain, or, headache

## The following are some signs and symptoms of addiction:

- Feeling that you have to use a drug/substance regularly
- Having intense urges for the drug/or action that block out any other thoughts
- Over time, needing more of the drug/substance to get the same effect
- Being secretive about the use/act
- Not meeting obligations, work, and/or personal responsibilities

Having one or two of these symptoms does not necessarily mean a person has a mental disorder or struggles with addiction. *However*, if someone is experiencing several of these symptoms, and they are interfering with the individual's ability to perform everyday tasks or take care of normal responsibilities, seeking behavioral health services can make a difference in that person's quality of life.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### (FAQ)

**How much do services cost?** – Many services are offered are based upon income, but there are also programs available that accept Medicaid, Medicare, and private insurance. Some services might be free to those who qualify.

**Do I need a referral to get help?** – You don't always need a referral. You can contact most services directly, but sometimes a referral from a doctor, school, or court may be help for or possibly required depending upon the program you are trying to enter.

**How do I know if I need behavioral health services?** – If you're overwhelmed, anxious, or are struggling with substance abuse or a mental health disorder it might be a good idea to reach out for help. Talking to a counselor or a medical professional can help you figure out if services are right for you!

**How do I file a complaint if I'm not happy with my care?** – You can file a complaint directly with the facility, The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction services, or our local office.

What if I'm asking for help for someone else? If you are concerned about a love one you can still reach out for advice. While you need to consent to provide an individual with direct services, we can guide you on how to talk to them about getting help and offer resources for family support.

What should I expect when I ask for help? — When you reach out for help the process usually starts with an assessment. A counselor or intake specialist will ask about your feeling, challenges, and goals to understand how best to support you. It's a safe non-judgmental conversation designed to get you the help you need.

What if I'm not ready to talk about everything? — Its okay if you don't feel ready to share everything at once. You can start by talking about what's comfortable for you. Opening up can be a very hard thing to do. Remember that the professionals are there to listen and work at a pace that is comfortable for you.

# The Addict's Parents (TAP)

United Face-to-Face Support Group tapunited.org Support Groups play a vital role in many peoples recovery, but some individuals may need more intensive or personalized care. Below is a more in depth understanding of treatment options so an individual can become more comfortable about the options they seek...

<u>Outpatient Programs</u> – For those who need flexibility, outpatient programs allow you to receive professional treatment while maintaining work or home responsibilities. (Counseling, education, medication management, ect...)

<u>Intensive Outpatient Programs (IOP)</u> – A step up from standard outpatient care, IOP provides more frequent sessions, helping you address the root cause of addiction while maintaining daily activities.

<u>Residential Treatment (Short Term)</u> – Inpatient care that is available for individuals needing a structured environment away from external pressures or environmental circumstances. These programs focus on stabilization and intensive therapy over several weeks.

Long term Treatment – Some individuals require extended care to ensure a strong foundation for their recovery. These types of programs can provide ongoing support with provided therapy, obtaining life skills while processing and addressing past trauma and reoccurring mental health and addiction issues.

<u>Detoxification Services</u> – For individuals who need help managing symptoms of withdrawal that is medically supervised to safely start the process of recovery

# **Your Rights In Treatment Facilities**

# It is important to be aware of your rights as a client in a treatment facility.

- Respect You deserve to be treated with kindness and respect no matter your situation
- Privacy Your personal information and treatment details are to be kept private. No one can share your records without your permission.
- Understanding your treatment You have the right to know what treatment you're getting and why. You can say yes or no to treatments unless it's an emergency
- Be Involved You can help decide your treatment plan and have a say in your care. If you don't agree with something, you can talk to your care team.
- File a complaint If you think your rights aren't being respected, you can file a complaint without worrying about any negative consequences.
- Safety You have the right to a safe, clean, and comfortable environment. Any treatment that feels harmful should be questioned.
- Practice your beliefs You can practice your religion or cultural traditions as long as it doesn't interfere with your care or others safety.
- 8. <u>Talk to loved ones</u> You can call, message, or have visits from family or friends, unless there's a safety reason not to.
- 9. <u>Leave treatment</u> If you're in voluntary treatment, you can choose to leave when ever you want, unless its unsafe for you and others
- Help with language If you don't speak English or have trouble understanding information, you have the right to get help, like a translator.
